Awards Luncheon

When: Wednesday, May 19 to Sunday, May 23, 2010.

For Whom: This event is open to U.S. and international male and female athletes with permanent physical disabilities ages 6 years through adulthood that are interested in competitive athletics. Disabilities may include but are not limited to:

Amputation

Muscular Dystrophy

Stroke

Cerebral Palsy

Osteogenesis Imperfecta

Traumatic Brain Injury

Dwarfism

Spina Bifida

Visual Impairment

Multiple Sclerosis

Spinal Cord Injury

Fee: A registration fee for athletes and coaches of \$50.00 includes unlimited number of events, commemorative event technical shirt, event plaque and Sunday Awards lunch. Guide runners must also register through www.active.com but will not be required to pay the registration fee.

Awards: Each registered athlete will receive a plaque. Awards will be given to all top three finishers in each event. The host organization will recognize the minus one rule for all races. This means that in order for a 1st place medal to be awarded, there must be a minimum of two individuals competing in any one division. In order for a 1st, 2nd and 3rd place medal to all be awarded, there must be a minimum of four individuals competing in the division.

Classification: Each athlete will be classified according to his or her functional ability, allowing him or her to compete against athletes with similar abilities. Each athlete who submits an entry to compete at the event must provide proof of permanent IPC (International) or National

classification. Athletes who do not have an international or national classification issued by their country of residence must complete a request for classification.

The Desert Challenge Games will be one of two U.S. events to offer International Classification in Athletics. The event will offer up to 32 appointments for International Classification on Wednesday, May 19th and Thursday, May 20th from 8:00am-6:00pm. Athletes will request an appointment for International Classification but the request does not guarantee that the athlete will receive an appointment time. All requests for International Classification must be received by May 1st to be considered for an appointment time. Athletes must be IPC Licensed in order to request an appointment. Individuals that do not wish to receive an International Sport Class may apply to receive a National Class on Friday, May 21st between 12:00pm-5:00pm. Athletes in need of a swim classification will be assigned an appointment time and must check-in on Friday between 9:00am-12:00pm at the host hotel.

Events will be heated based on classification and age division. All awards will be separated based on classification, age and gender.

Age Divisions are as follows:

Futures	Through age 6	Division D	Under 20 (17,18,19)
Division A	Under 11 (7,8,9,10)	Division E	Under 23 (20,21,22)
Division B	Under 14 (11,12,13)	Adults	Ages 23-39

Please Note: Competitive age for Wheelchair and Ambulatory Sports, USA is determined by the athlete's age in the competition year (athlete age in 2010).

Coaches: The registration website (www.active.com) offers the option to register the entire team. The team's information can be picked up by one representative at Check-in on Friday.

Disabled Sports Organizations & Membership Info:

Juniors must be a member of Wheelchair and Ambulatory Sports USA to participate in National Junior Disability Championships (NJDC). Even if the individual belongs to DSUSA or NDSA/Blaze, the athlete needs to be a member of WASUSA for NJDC. Athletes do not need to be registered with a Disability Sports Organization (DSO) to attend the adult nationals.

Athletes must have a 2010 IPC License in order to request a classification appointment and for results to count for the IPC World Rankings, IPC World Records and World Championships qualification.

Drug Testing: Drug testing will be conducted by and follow all U.S. Anti-Doping Agency (USADA) policies and procedures. All athletes who enter track and field events will be subject to drug testing. For more information about USADA please visit: www.usantidoping.org.

Equipment: The Desert Challenge Games committee will provide all sanctioned field implements, archery targets and starting blocks. Athletes must provide their own helmet for all junior events and middle and long distance track events. Implement weigh-in is scheduled for Friday, May 21st from 5:00pm-7:00pm at the track and field venue for athletes bringing their own implements. Guide runners must provide their own vests. Track spikes that are longer than a quarter inch are not allowed. Quarter inch pyramids or “Christmas trees” are allowed. No “needles” of any kind are allowed on the track.

Lodging: Lodging arrangements are the responsibility of each team or individual athlete. When making reservations, state that you are part of the “Desert Challenge Games” to receive the discounted rate available through **May 9, 2010**.

Medical: Athletes must have clearance from a physician or physician’s assistant in order to compete in the sports competition. A copy of a medical physical can be faxed to 480-610-2257. Each registrant is required to accept the waiver of liability forms on the www.active.com website.

Registration: Registration will begin on Monday, April 5th, 2010 on the event website: www.desertchallengegames.com and www.active.com. Each athlete/coach/guide must register on-line. Registration includes access to the competition and Sunday Awards Lunch. The registration fee will be based on the following schedule:
\$50.00 on or before May 3, 2010 at 5:00pm PST
\$75.00 from May 3 at 5:01pm PST to May 14, 2010 at 5:00pm PST
Registration will be closed on May 14, 2010 at 5:01pm PST

Results: Once all results are reviewed and verified, they will be posted at the competition venue. Athlete’s results for all events are given to each registrant at the awards lunch and final results will be posted on the games website after the completion of the event.
Athletes must have a 2010 IPC License in order to request a classification appointment and for results to count for the IPC World Rankings, IPC World Records and World Championships

Sanctioning: International Paralympic Committee (IPC), USA Track and Field (USATF) and Wheelchair & Ambulatory Sports USA will sanction the track and field events and the IPC and IAAF rules will govern the track and field competition. A copy of the rules is located at www.paralympic.org. Wheelchair and Ambulatory Sports USA will sanction the archery, swimming and weightlifting events and the WASUSA rules will govern the competitions. A copy of the rules is located at www.wasusa.org.

The Games will be offering two All-Comers events – 60 M for ambulatory runners only and the 1500 M cycling event for experienced cyclists. Athletes will be required to registration online under Track Events. The times for these events will not count for World Rankings and will not qualify individuals for National competitions. Athletes will be placed into heats with various classifications and ages for the All-Comers events.

*Athletes can qualify for competition in the National Junior Disability Championships, the National Veterans Wheelchair Games and various other events and meets by meeting the qualifying standards in their respective events.
